

JUMPING UP

Dog Training Tips



- Jumping up is one of the hardest problems to control and stop due to inconsistencies among people greeting your puppy.
- In order to stop the problem behaviour it is very important every one follows the same rules, consistency is paramount. Ensure all family members abide by the rules you set.
- All greetings inside or outside should be kept low key to prevent your dog from becoming excited
- Your pup must be on a lead or line when meeting people to ensure complete control as you can stand on the line to ensure jumping up is not possible
- The dog should be calmly praised when approaching or meeting a person and four paws are on the ground.
- Do not verbally reprimanded if he jumps up as he may see this as a reward or as a command associated with the behaviour being shown

- At home have another capable person control the dog or shut him away in another room until the visitors are in and settled then introduce your dog on a line or lead.
- The key to success is not allowing the dog the opportunity to jump up. The more he is allowed to jump up the stronger the behaviour will become
- Never reward your dog with attention when it does jump up
- Reward the dog when it sits at any time for attention.
